The Main Street Post Office holds standard hours during the Festival, although it is best to pick up your mail before 1:00 p.m. 15-minute parking spaces are available along 5th Street.

Transit, Shuttles, Taxis, Rideshare, and Carpool Information

HIGH VALLEY TRANSIT (HVT)

HVT is Summit County's new transportation system, serving riders in the Wasatch Back with micro and fixed route services.

Microtransit

Park City Transit launched a microtransit pilot program this winter by partnering with High Valley Transit to temporarily expand their Micro zones serving the Thaynes Canyon, Upper Park Meadows, and Royal Street neighborhoods..

STREETS AND TRAFFIC

If driving, please Turn your Key and Be Idle Free! --- Do not cut through residential neighborhoods.

Temporary One-Way Streets

In order to reduce residential traffic, increase transit priority and ensure public safety, the following streets will be one-way from January 19-28. Please follow all posted signs:

- Park Avenue – one-way north (downhill)
- Hillside Avenue – one-way west (downhill)
- Main Street – one way north (downhill)
- Swede Alley – one way south (uphill)

Drop and Load, Taxis, RideShare, Shuttles

To use Drop and Load areas, drivers must remain in the vehicle, pull to curb as to not block traffic, and actively drop and load passengers. Double parked vehicles will be ticketed. Drop and Load areas are also available at the following locations:

General Drop & Load Areas (Taxi, Hotel Shuttles, General Public, and Rideshares):

- South Marsac Lot
- 9th Street Trolley Turnaround
- Brew Pub Parking Lot
- Heber Avenue (by Courchevel/Main and Sky)

Lyft Pick Up/Drop Off Area

Will be located on Swede Alley behind Dolly's Bookstore and the Park City Museum.

**Drop, Load, and Staging (DLS) program is suspended during the Festival. No permit is required to use drop and load areas.*

Residential Areas

Whether you are visiting, providing transportation services, heading to work, heading to ski, or picking up a friend, please do not cut through residential areas. During the Festival, additional security will be in place to deter cut-through traffic in residential areas.

Residential Access Passes will be distributed in early January 6. If you need additional Residential Access Passes, please contact Jenny Diersen at 435.640.5063 or come by the Special Events Office, 3rd Floor City Hall at 445 Marsac Avenue.

Residential Access Passes are not valid for Main Street or Swede Alley. All traffic on Main Street or Swede Alley must follow posted directions and signs.

Winter Streets Maintenance

Park City completes winter maintenance for all public parking lots and streets between 2:00 a.m.-6:00 a.m. daily. Overnight parking is not permitted in public lots. Cars left in public lots or on streets are subject to ticketing or towing at the owner's expense.

Most private parking lots also perform snow maintenance during this time. Please help our plow drivers by making sure your car is not blocking their ability to clear snow.

PARKING

Public parking in the Old Town area will be by permit or pay only January 19-29, 2023. Main Street patrons and employees are encouraged to ride the bus to avoid parking challenges and congestion. During the Festival, the last bus leaves the Main Street Transit Center at 2:00 a.m.

Parking Closures

During the following dates, parking will be removed at the following locations:

- **January 12-February 1:** Bob Wells Plaza
- **January 18-30:** North Marsac Parking Lot, partial closure
- **January 17-18:** West Side of Main Street
- **January 18-28:** Park Avenue (from Heber to 9th Street)
- **January 19-28:** All of Main Street, Heber Avenue, Swede Alley Surface Parking Brew Pub Parking Lot (spaces available for ADA), West Side of Park Avenue (restricted to resident parking only), Flagpole Lot (Employee Permit Only), Galleria Lot (ADA parking only)

Parking Permit Holders

During the Festival, Business Permit holders (carpool, employee, business) may park in the Flagpole Lot, Gateway Center, Sandridge Lots, or in the North Marsac Lot. Free parking is available at Richardson Flat Park and Ride with transit service to Main Street.

A permit guaranteeing a spot in the China Bridge garage is available for \$550 and is valid from January 19-28. Entry for guaranteed parking is from Swede Alley. This permit is available from parkcity.org/departments/parking or by calling 435.615.5301.



FREE PARKING

Richardson Flat Park-and-Ride

Free parking with free transit (every 20 minutes) to and from Prospector/Old Town, from 5:45 a.m.-2:00 a.m., January 19-28. Last bus to Richardson Flat leaves the Old Town Transit Center at 2:00 a.m.

Ecker Hill Park-and-Ride (2465 Kilby Road)

High Valley Transit runs from the Ecker Hill Park-and-Ride approximately every 15 minutes during peak hours.

Sandridge Lots

Free parking access via Marsac Avenue.

Note: these lots will fill early each morning.

Deer Valley Parking Lots

Deer Valley Resort will allow the use of their parking lots outside of resort hours during the Festival. Resort lots are available for parking from 5:00 p.m.-1:00 a.m., daily from January 19-28.

- Vehicles left in the lots after 1:00 a.m. will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Parking for festival attendance is prohibited in resort lots during daytime hours.
- Free Park City Transit connects the resort to the Old Town Transit Center, from where you can walk or transfer buses.
- Please mind all posted signs and regulations in parking lots.

Homestake Lot (1875 Homestake Road)

Proper vehicle registration required. Free transit is available within a short walking distance from the parking lot, from 8:00 a.m.-2:00 a.m. throughout the Festival, with an on-call Guaranteed Ride Home after 3:00 a.m. (details below).

Guaranteed Ride Home

The Guaranteed Ride Home (GRH) program reimburses area employees for paid transportation that occurs outside of Park City Transit's hours of operation or if unexpected transportation is needed. Registration is required.

PERMITTED PARKING

Load In/Out and Crowd Management

Permits are required to load in/out of a Main Street venue, for crowd control, and satellite truck parking. There is no parking allowed on Main Street, only active loading and unloading.

Call 435.615.5301 to obtain a “Special Use of Load In/Load Out” Permit. Permit deadline is 72 hours prior to any instance noted above. Details [here](#).

Business Permit Holders

During the Festival, Business Permit holders (carpool, employee, business) may park in the Flagpole Lot, Gateway Center, Sandridge Lots, or in the North Marsac Lot.

Guaranteed Parking

A permit guaranteeing a spot in the China Bridge garage is available for \$550 and is valid from January 19-28. Entry for guaranteed parking is from Swede Alley. This permit is available from parkcity.org/departments/parking or by calling 435.615.5301.



PAID PARKING

Private Paid Parking

There are various private parking garages throughout Old Town. Private parking lots have their own payment structures and regulations — costs vary \$20-100+ per day.

China Bridge Parking Structure

Entry from Marsac Avenue only. No in and out privileges.

- **January 19:** \$40
- **January 20-21:** \$50
- **January 22-23:** \$40
- **January 24-26:** 8:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. \$1 per hour/ \$30 for 5th hour.
6:00 p.m.-midnight: \$4/hour
- **January 27-28:** \$30
- **January 29:** All parking returns to normal rates

ADA Parking

ADA spaces are available at the Top of China Bridge (entry from Marsac Avenue), Brew Pub and Galleria Parking Lot. All City parking lots that are open to the public will continue to offer ADA spaces.
